The Head Coach will develop and manage the senior supplementary training program that complements the NPL competition. The Head Coach will also manage and deliver the training and match environment for the Talent Support Program for youth boys.

#### General

- Develop and implement a Canberra United playing philosophy for the Youth League team and underpinning age grades.
- Develop the overarching football plan for the Canberra United program.
- Contribute to budget development for the Canberra United Program.
- Perform all duties as required by the CEO and Technical Director.
- Consult with Capital Football's Technical Director in relation to the technical direction and development of men's football in the ACT.

### Canberra United in the Youth League

- Provide leadership, coaching, management, strategic, tactical and technical direction to the team.
- Provide support and advice to other coaching staff.
- Analyse matches of opposing teams as part of match preparation.
- Provide reports to Capital Football's Technical Director as requested.
- Monitor the playing, fitness, availability, progress and well-being of all players.
- Attend all matches, training sessions, camps and meetings of the team.

## **Canberra United Winter Program**

# **Talent Support Program**

- Prepare the coaches for the season.
- Assess the coaches and assist them develop while providing a learning environment aligned to the Canberra United playing philosophy and football plan.
- Monitor the playing, fitness, availability, progress and well-being of all players.
- Deliver sessions and attend matches as required by the Technical Director, including taking the head coach role for an agreed age grade.
- Attend TSP elite matches and NPL matches to identify players.
- Engage with NPL coaches to build a network of coaches supporting the development of young players.
- Prepare a report on the program, including outcomes, opportunities and challenges.

### **Coach Education**

- Work with the Coach Development Manager to train as a Coach Educator
- Assist the Coach Development Manager to organise and deliver Advanced and Community Coaching Courses/Workshops.
- Assist the Coach Development Manager in practical assessments of Coaching Courses.
