NPL/CPL Competition Regulations

This document briefly introduces revised competition regulations for the NPL/CPL competitions. Not every section or article in the current competition regulations have been reviewed, with the revisions addressing matters arising during the competitions in 2022.

- Criteria for eligibility to participate in the NPL/CPL have been updated, such update including the removal of ground criteria - ground control deemed to be the responsibility in most cases of the ACT Government and Capital Football (Schedule 2)
- Sections relating to Relative Age Effect (RAE) have been replaced by Sections providing for a 'Biological Maturation' approach to requests for age eligibility exemptions relating to developmental stage of a talented player (Section 3 Articles 3.7-3.19)
- 3. Squad numbers have been increased to reflect current and likely ongoing issues relating to COVID (Section 4 Article 8)
- 4. Greater flexibility is provided for young players to play up into teams within their club, including in finals (Section 3 Article 4)
- 5. A limit is now set on Visa players (Section 4 Article 7)
- 6. Sections relating to Club Vested Officials have been expanded to provide detail on the responsibilities in the role (Section 5 Article 10.5)
- 7. Provisions relating to the rescheduling of games have been simplified (Section 2 Article 10)
- 8. Sections relating to forfeits have been significantly revised and address, inter alia, the previous approach of potential sanctions of all teams for the forfeits of one team (Section 2 Article 11)
- 9. Provisions relating to CUA have been significantly revised to allow CUA teams to compete at the same level as other teams
- 10. Fines have been increased for some breaches (Schedule 4)
- 11. Delegations to Management have been articulated (Section 1 Article 3)
